Jesus approached the man and his first words to the man were, "Do you want to be well?" Seemed like a strange question to ask a crippled

Unpacking the Word

Psalm 27:14

7 God, hear my cry. Show me your grace. Show me mercy, and send the help I need!

8 Lord, when you said to me, "Seek my face,"my inner being responded, "I'm seeking your face with all my heart."

9 So don't hide yourself, Lord, when I come to find you. You're the God of my salvation; how can you reject your servant in anger? You've been my only hope, so don't forsake me now when I need you!

10 My father and mother abandoned me. I'm like an orphan! But you took me in and made me yours.

11 Now teach me all about your ways and tell me what to do. Make it clear for me to understand, for I am surrounded by waiting enemies.

12 Don't let them defeat me, Lord. You can't let me fall into their clutches! They keep accusing me of things I've never done while they plot evil against me.

13 Yet I totally trust you to rescue me one more time, so that I can see once again how good you are while I'm still alive!

14 Here's what I've learned through it all: Don't give up; don't be impatient; be entwined as one with the Lord. Be brave and courageous, and never lose hope. Yes, keep on waiting—for he will never disappoint you!

As I ponder this chapter of Psalm 27 I see the fear in which David must have walked in at times. Fear can envelope us and hold us captive within its dark shadow. Each one of us has been a prisoner of fear at one time or another – fear of rejection, sickness.

misunderstanding, death etc. We have to remember that God can conquer anything. The Lord is our light and our shield – He can dispel the darkness of fear. Many have experienced the losses that David talks about, abandonment of a mother, rejection of a father; etc. God is able to fill the void left by these past hurts; he is all that we need.

Around verse 7 David begins to show his fears and insecurities. He pleads for help then talks himself down with God's words... "You said"... but then he responds to God almost as a "but I am seeking your face"...why hasn't this happened for me yet, why haven't I seen breakthrough etc...

Once again he says..."So why are you hiding, my mom left me too!" But, as though he was kicking the dirt and sighing...he says "well, but you did take me in..."

David then goes on to say "teach me, help me understand but in the same breath always seems to plead but don't let them...."
There is an underlying insecurity within his faith

*Have you ever been there? Do you quote the Word boldly and in the same breath question and doubt..."Will this really ever happen Lord?" We have all been there. David eventually gets it and so will we! Verse 14: "I have learned-don't give up or be impatient, be brave and courageous and never loose hope! He will never disappoint!"

David knew from experience what it meant to wait on the Lord. He was 16 when he was anointed to be king but did not fulfill that role until he was 30. Waiting is not easy and sometimes we may think that God is not answering our prayers or does not understand the urgency in our situation. This kind of thinking implies that we believe God is not in control. In Lamentations 3:24-26 says to hope and wait for the Lord; because often in the waiting God uses it to refresh, renew and teach us! We need to make good use of the waiting times in our lives to hear what God may be teaching us. May you find hope and encouragement in those times of waiting. You are loved!
